Janseva is leading NGO of Central India working in the tribal belt in Yavatmal, Wardha and Hingoli districts of Maharashtra. The organization has been mobilizing women in rural areas to form self-help groups in Yavatmal and Wardha districts of Maharashtra. It organizes special training programmes and co-ordinates workshops on issues such as gender and development, reproductive child health and care, adolescent girls awareness programmes etc. It also works with elected representatives of gram Panchayats. To cater to the needs of women in distress in rural areas, it operates two counseling centers that provide socio-legal assistance. Janseva works closely with the district administration, police and judiciary. It is a member of the district consultative/vigilance committee.

Janseva Gramin Vikas Va Shikshan Pratishthan , meaning society for rural development and education, is a development organization located in The central goal has been to bring women and the poor into the center stage of local governance and development processes, to place their respective concerns at the center of village, taluka, district level planning, budgeting etc.. JANSEVA's role as a facilitating organization opens up strategic spaces for participation of grassroots women's collectives on one hand, build and strengthen organizational capabilities through self education, participation in local planning and governance mechanisms, demonstration and scaling up of initiatives and forging resource linkages with institutional actors.

HEALTH

Comprehensive Elderly Care Program

3. Set up of Activity Centers

The permitted places were cleaned with the help of volunteers and project banner, other IEC banners and physical exercise material were installed there. Initially, the number of attendees was less since the focus was on community awareness. As the number of attendees gradually increased, the other activities initiated by coordinators and volunteers and ensured the active engagement of all elderly.

Routine activities include physical exercises, yoga, Pranayam, regional songs (*Bhajan*) while special activities focus on skill building.

Current Status

At present, a total of **75 Activity Centers are functional**. Routine activities are undertaken by volunteers and Block Co-ordinators are monitoring the same. On an average, 25-30 elderly attend these routine activities on regular basis.

In addition, skill building activities are undertaken primarily to sustain the constant engagement of Elderly.

Volunteers and Block Co-ordinators visits the household of the Elderly who are not well or unable to attend the sessions.

Community Awareness/IEC

Community sensitization towards elderly care is crucial to promote the elder friendly community. Therefore different modes were used to create the awareness such as wall paintings, audio messages, street play etc.

1. Wall paintings

Wall paintings with the text of Marathi Language are designed and painted across all villages in order to create awareness about healthy diet, physical activities and constant engagement in *Activity Centers*.

2. Street Plays

Street plays were conducted in all 75 villages. The theme was health issues of Elderly, Elderly abuse, social security schemes, senior citizen maintenance act (Amendment 2019). The local group of theater artists perform street play on common health issues such as diabetes, hypertension.

3. Audio Messages

The audio messages were developed to create the awareness on Elderly Care and Covid-19 pandemic, messages were disseminated through digital media and shared with Gram Panchayat members at village level.

4. Community Meetings and Home Visits

Block Coordinators/Volunteers visits the households of Elderly and Counsel them on good/nutritious diet and encourage attending the Activity Center on regular basis. Caregivers are also counseled to engage elderly in household chore which help them to be stress free.

Provision of Healthcare for elderly

NCD/GC

Routine check-up is the mandatory need during old age. Therefore, regular NCD camps and multispecialty health camps are being conducted since this initiative aims to support and strengthen the geriatric care at community as well as at health facility level. During FY 2021, Geriatric Clinics could not be conducted due to Covid-19 pandemic so this gap has been fulfilled this year. A total of 645 Geriatric Clinics were conducted at PHC/SC level.

Multi-specialty Health Camps and Referral

A multi-specialty health camps are conducted at village level since the medicine and specialty services scarcity at PHC/SC level. During FY 2022, a total of 8 multi-specialty camps have been conducted with the association of local Private Practitioners and Acharya Vinoba Bhave Rural Hospital, Sawangi Meghe.

Following specialty services, free check-up and medicines were provided during these camps

1. General Medicine
2. Ophthalmology
3. Orthopedics
4. Gynecology
5. Pediatrics
6. Dermatology
7. Dental Services

The patients those need advance/surgical treatment were referred to AVBRH, Hospital, Sawangi Meghe. The transport was arranged by hospital only.

COVID 19 Support activities

In the second wave of COVID 19, infection penetrated the rural areas beyond estimation. The rapid spread of the covid 19 in the rural community disrupted the life of people who were dealing with aftermath of the first wave and lockdown. In Covid 19 pandemic Janseva has taken up the activities of ration kit distribution, awareness activities, support to covid vaccination drive in Chandrapur and Yavatmal.

2.1 Distribution of Ration kits:

Elderly is vulnerable section of society. Covid 19 aggravated the already existing issues. Janseva Pratishthan distributed dry ration kits to **1500** vulnerable households in the selected villages of intervention area. The kit contains dry ration and other essentials (see Annexure 1) for approx. 20 to 25 days. This dry ration kits are distributed to the elderly living alone with no support of care givers, elderly couple with low or no farming land in the villages, differently abled people. Prior permission was sought from block and gram panchayat by sharing the list of beneficiaries and the name of villages. We also distributed **3000** face masks, **1500** sanitizers and **1500** soap for handwashing practices to in the community.

- To ensure safety net for healthcare facilitator in the face masks and sanitizer are provided **250** frontline workers.
- We Supported to the gram panchayat for isolation centre by bridging the gap in essential consumables masks, sanitizers, PPE kit and gloves

2.2 Covid 19 Vaccination: Support activity

Transport facility support for vaccination against covid 19:

- Vaccination against covid 19 is important tool to control and contain the COVID 19 in long term. However, in the rural area people are facing issues to go to the vaccination centres to get the vaccine shot owing to distance of vaccination centre and lack of lack of transportation facilities. The vaccination centres are at primary health centre and selected health and wellness centres; limited number of outreach camps are conducted for vaccination. The average distance one need to travel from the other village to the vaccination centre is 10-12 kms.

We provide the transport facility to the elderly people to reach to the vaccination centre. The refreshment and nutrition's are given to the total elderly during vaccination time this refreshment was helpful to elderly. We had supported **1789** elderly to access the vaccination centers to take their first dose of vaccine till Sep 23, 2021.

- While working in community we learned that the elderlies are reluctant to take the second dose and complete the vaccination owing to bad experiences after first shot. These people are visited by our field coordinators and volunteers counselled and motivated to take 2nd dose of vaccine. **1351** elderlies supported to take complete the vaccination These efforts translated into supporting total **3140** elderlies to access vaccination centers (till 23 Sept 2021). The total population we catered till dated 20th September 2021 is **13181**.

Facilitation of Vaccination Camp

- To improve the access and availability of vaccine at community level, we are worked closely with health department and facilitating camp of covid 19 vaccine at the village level. We have supported **100** outreach camps in our intervention areas and facilitated the vaccination of **13181** people.

- Assisting people to complete the registration process: Our team is assisting people to register for the vaccination and complete the vaccination. Follow up with people after vaccination.

2.3. Awareness Activity

The extensive IEC is being done in the community on vaccine hesitancy and covid appropriate behavior. The misinformation among the community regarding the current situation of covid 19, We are putting our efforts to provide the updated appropriate information on the covid 19. We are targeting the five behaviors specific to covid 19: 1. Use of Mask, 2. Handwashing after coming back to home, 3. Keeping physical distance outside the home, 4 Getting vaccination and 5. Getting help from health centre or from community health worker in case of covid 19 symptoms.

The awareness activity is done through home visits, audio messages, community meetings, drawing and rangoli competition,

Community mobilization for vaccination is done with the help of village volunteers and community leaders. People in community were reached out with home visits, community meetings and motivated to get the vaccination. In this communication we talked about the feelings and action planning for the vaccination. The positive shift was observed in the community after extensive IEC, people are coming forward to take the vaccination.

Skill Development

Janseva Pratisthan has been conducted on various skill development training like Computer Skill, Beauty Parlor, Tailoring and Motor mechanic

Objective of Skill Development Training as given below.

Skill development encompasses several vital attributes, including identifying one's skill gaps and enabling one to develop those skills to achieve their goal. In other words, it refers to systematic and sustained efforts towards improving one's ability to perform job-related activities.

Total 100 Student trained under this training and 60 Student got the job and secure livelihood.

DIGITAL EDUCATION GUARANTEE CARD PROJECT {DEGC}

DEPT OF EDUCATION, TATA TRUSTS AND JANSEVA PRATISTHAN, COLLECTIVELY PRESENTS DIGITAL EDUCATION GUARANTEE CARD

PROJECT STRUCTURE

The project is implemented in approximately 26 villages, 80 to 90 schools in the geographical jurisdiction of Someshwar Sugar factory. It is observed that migrant sugar cane cutter labor arrive in the month of October and settle in 100 to 120 small and medium hamlets, in and around those 26 villages. There are 35 village coordinators are front line workers who implements project programs and collect data. Four field coordinators monitor and implement project program and address issues raised by village coordinator within their blocks. One part time counselor has been appointed to address the mental health of children, parents, caregivers and labor contractors in the high stress driven sugarcane cutting atmosphere of a given season. Project director provides the vision and leadership for implementation of scheduled project activities and monitor impact by collecting needed data. The Program Manager of TATA TRUSTS works in coordination with the project director and provides needed guidance and support for smooth and seamless implementation of the project. SCERT has acknowledged this project and have joined hands as a collaborator and implementing partner. A Govt. teacher Anil Chachar was on deputation for this project for the academic year of 2019 to 2020. State education department and TATA TRUSTS have jointly initiated this project and Janseva Pratisthan is acting as implementation partner. Management body of Someshwar Sugar Factory has time to time express their support to this project.

72% of the total sugar cane cutter belongs to SC, ST and other backward classes. Lack of employment, lack of agricultural land, lack of irrigation facilities, for agricultural facilities are the reasons why families from central and northern Maharashtra are becoming sugar cane cutter labor. 2019-20 witnessed approximately 32% labor from ST and SC which

increase to 52% in 2020-21. 35% of total sugar cane cutter laborers were NT and VJNT in 2019-20. This was reduced to 23% in 2020-21. There is a negligible number from the OBC community at sugar cane cutter labor.

CHALLENGES IN ENROLLING CHILDREN IN SCHOOL

Children were enrolled in the above school as per above table until the corona outbreak in March 2022. We have studied the reasons that prevented children from going to school. The Principal reason is that kids have to accompany their parents and seldom help in cutting sugar cane. They don't like school, they have to take care of their siblings, parents do not approve their school going, domestic work, and internal migration within sugar cane factory jurisdiction are other key reasons for enrolling in the school. We tried to work on two main reasons that prevented children from going to school, namely they don't like school and they have accompany their parent in cutting sugar cane.

DIGITAL EDUCATION GUARANTEE CARD

Last two years we have been following up with the government agencies to get digital education guarantee cards from schools to migrant children as per October 2015 GR. In the first step of the project we issued the DEGC cards from the project itself. The inputs given on reading and writing improvement in 2020-21 were included in that card. Later all this information was visible on the DEGC dashboard itself. 624 children in 2020-21 and 608 children in 2021-22 were issued DEGC cards.

Project outcomes

1. 4019 families were surveyed. 4210 children in the age group of 0 to 18 were recorded. 2194 children of age group six to fourteen were included in the project to enroll them in school and give them their due right to education.

2. 216 out of school children other than sugar cane cutter's labour children were surveyed in 2019-20. 159 children out of that were enrolled in school.
3. 1670 children were given reading writing inputs to improve their reading skills in the last two years.
4. Around Seven Lakh, seventy eight thousand rupees were raised from community contributions to support the project.
5. Rohan Prakashan published a book on anecdotes and diaries of village coordinators edited by Program Manager Paresh Jayashree Manohar and Project Manager Santosh Sendkar. The book *Shinkshan kondi* received the karmaveer Bhaurao Patil shikshan shastra award under Yashwantrao Chavan best literature award.
6. Another book showcasing work of the project in another five year of project is under production

IMPACT OF THE PROJECT

1. Former agriculture minister of Govt. of India Hon. Sharad Pawar, sitting MP Supriya Sule, Deputy chief minister of Maharashtra were approached with 'AASHA' a coffee table book showcasing life pain and struggle of sugarcane cutters in migrant areas. The honorable leaders carefully listened to the project and provided their best wishes and support for the project.
2. Project team drafted a concept of migration friendly village and created an outline for the village, community and administration to execute the concept. MP Supriya tai Sule promised that she would present a bill in the parliament on this topic. Hon. Sharad Pawar gave his valuable input in the draft and suggested the project team to meet Rural Development Minister Maharashtra state and Labor Welfare Minister Dilip Walase Patil Maharashtra state and MLA Rohit Pawar.
3. Migrant children should have a Digital education guarantee card. That card should help the child to get admission to any school in Maharashtra without any additional paperwork. This season the school shall fill all the progress of the child in the same digital education guarantee card and send it back to the original school. The education department showed tremendous inertness towards the DEGC. The project team persistently kept following up with the Education Commissioner and SCERT's Samata unit

4. To create an APP to trace out of school children and migrant children, two meetings were conducted in SCERT by the education department TATA TRUSTS and Unicef in 2019-20. The APP- *Balrakshak* is finally made with the initiation of TATA TRUSTS, SCERT's Samata Unit, education department, NIC and Unicef.
5. MLA Mr. Suresh Dhas raised the question in the assembly regarding the migration issue of sugar cane cutter labor. Social justice minister Dhanajay Munde replied to the question saying there has been a scheme designed to establish hostels for migrant sugar cane cutter's children labor. 5 such hostels shall be established.
4. Project team has requested many politicians, social worker and Member of Parliament Mr. Raju shetty to take the issue of migrant sugar cane cutter children in the agricultural organization and movements. The question of migrant sugar cane cutter's children was raised in a sugar conference organized by the sugar cooperative unions.
5. The project team has persistently followed up with the Women and Child Development department to receive school nutrition program benefits to the migrant children as well. After prolonged follow up Pune district migrant children received the benefits.
