Janseva is leading NGO of Central India working in the tribal belt in Yavatmal, Wardha and Hingoli districts of Maharashtra. The organization has been mobilizing women in rural areas to form self-help groups in Yavatmal and Wardha districts of Maharashtra. It organizes special training programmes and co-ordinates workshops on issues such as gender and development, reproductive child health and care, adolescent girls awareness programmes etc. It also works with elected representatives of gram Panchayats. To cater to the needs of women in distress in rural areas, it operates two counseling centers that provide socio-legal assistance. Janseva works closely with the district administration, police and judiciary. It is a member of the district consultative/vigilance committee.

Janseva is playing a key role as a facilitating organization opens up strategic spaces for participation of grassroots women's collectives on one hand, build and strengthen organizational capabilities through self education, Awareness on Child Protection issues like, Child Marriage, Child Sexual Abuse and Child Labour participation in local planning and governance mechanisms, demonstration and scaling up of initiatives and forging resource linkages with institutional actors.

We work with government bodies, international organization like UNICEF, Indo-German Watershed Development and NABARD in various initiatives in empowering women, reducing the rate of school dropouts, improving farm practices and strengthening grassroots organization with a view to fostering sustainable development and improving livelihoods. We have been an active partner with NABARD in developing watersheds in Chandrapur, Yavatmal and Wardha districts.

A distinguishing feature of Janseva is the strong grassroots level field network with a vast base of knowledge of local resources. This is supported with a managerial team endowed with wide variety of conceptual and management skills for project planning, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation

Programmatic Interventions in 2022-2023

HEALTH

Comprehensive Elderly Care Program, Chandrapur

Janseva Gramin Vikas Va Shikshan Pratisthan has working on Comprehensive Elderly Care Program, in 75 Villages in 5 Blocks of Chandrapur District.

- The Chandrapur model for Healthcare of Elderly was presented in the Govt. of India's "Best, Innovative and Replicable Practices Summit, 2019" by Govt. of Maharashtra and Tata Trusts (MoHFWGoI 2019)
- The Chandrapur model for Healthcare of Elderly was featured as a best practice in GoI'sAyushman Bharat Health and Wellness Centre Report (Apr 2018-Sep2019) (MoHFW; GoI 2019).
- 500 elderly people have been trained in Bag, Rakhi, Greeting Card, Diya making and are continuing to make things through that.
- 15000 Elderly got benefits of Medical and Other health services from the project



Skill Development

Janseva Pratisthan has been conducted on various skill development training like Computer Skill, Beauty Parlor, Tailoring and Motor mechanic

Under the Skill Development Program, training in tailoring, computers, beauty parlors, nursing, and two-wheelers repair was provided to 616 boys and 200 girls, enabling them to gain employment And some young boys & girls started their business.

- Skill development encompasses several vital attributes, including identifying one's skill gaps and enabling one to develop those skills to achieve their goal. In other words, it refers to systematic and sustained efforts towards improving one's ability to perform job-related activities.
- Total 100 Student trained under this training and 60 Student got the job and secure livelihood.
- Janseva has been Running Vocation skill training program at Pandharkawada on Electronics, Motor Mechanic, Beauty Parlor, Sewing Machine and Computer Skills through MAHARASHTRA STATE SKILL DEVELOPMENT SOCIETY and District Industrial Center with 200 youths (Girls and Boys). Ø 50 youth started own business and earn 10000/- PM Ø 42 Youth got the job in various place and earn 8 to 10 thousand PM.
- Under the Skill Development Scheme, 200 boys and girls were trained in sewing, computers, shoe parlour, nursing and two wheeler repair and provided employment to them.




Water & Soil conservation

Since 1996, Janseva Pratishtan's collaborative efforts with NABARD, Watershed Organization Trust, the Government of India, and Reliance Foundation in watershed management have empowered farmers to enhance crop yields through improved irrigation practices in 35 Villages in 14800 Hq. and 5000 Farmers Benefited.

Janseva is actively engaged in implementing various innovative technologies. Janseva covered 833.30 ha area by using this technology. Zataka battery (helps to 100 farmers) and Battery Operated spray (Helps to 4 FPC and 1 PG) this has been a great achievement by Janseva.



DEPT OF EDUCATION, TATA TRUSTS AND JANSEVA PRATISTHAN, COLLECTIVELY PRESENTS DIGITAL EDUCATION GUARANTEE CARD

The project is implemented in approximately 26 villages, 80 to 90 schools in the geographical jurisdiction of Someshwar Sugar factory. It is observed that migrant sugar cane cutter labor arrive in the month of October and settle in 100 to 120 small and medium hamlets, in and around those 26 villages. There are 35 village coordinators are front line workers who implements project programs and collect data. Four field coordinators monitor and implement project program and address issues raised by village coordinator within their blocks. One part time counselor has been appointed to address the mental health of children, parents, caregivers and labor contractors in the high stress driven sugarcane cutting atmosphere of a given season. Project director provides the vision and leadership for implementation of scheduled project activities and monitor impact by collecting needed data. The Program Manager of TATA TRUSTS works in coordination with the project director and provides needed guidance and support for smooth and seamless implementation of the project. SCERT has acknowledged this project and have joined hands as a collaborator and implementing partner. A Govt. teacher Anil Chachar was on deputation for this project for the academic year of 2019 to 2020. State education department and TATA TRUSTS have jointly initiated this project and Janseva Pratishthan is acting as implementation partner. Management body of Someshwar Sugar Factory has time to time express their support to this project.

72% of the total sugar cane cutter belongs to SC, ST and other backward classes. Lack of employment, lack of agricultural land, lack of irrigation facilities, for agricultural facilities are the reasons why families from central and northern Maharashtra are becoming sugar cane cutter labor. 2019-20 witnessed approximately 32% labor from ST and SC which
